From San Jose: Take Highway 17 to Santa Cruz. Follow the signs for Highway 1 N. to Half Moon Bay. Continue to follow signs for Half Moon Bay past light at Hwy 9. At 2nd light exit right onto Mission Street. Take immediate 1st right on Highland Ave. Go two blocks to stop sign and turn left on High St. Church is approx 1 mile on right & is 2nd church on right.

From Watsonville: Take Highway 1 toward Santa Cruz. Stay on 1 through the 'fishhook curve'. Follow signs for Half Moon Bay. At the second light (1st light is Hwy 9) exit right onto Mission St. Take immediate 1st right on Highland Ave. Go two blocks to stop sign and turn left on High St. Church is approx 1 mile on right and is 2nd church on right.

From Half Moon Bay: Take Highway 1 towards Santa Cruz. Continue past Davenport to Santa Cruz. As Highway 1 enters Santa Cruz, it also becomes Mission St. Take Mission to Bay Ave.(light) (signs for UC Santa Cruz at Bay Ave.) Turn left on Bay. Continue to the light at the University main entrance at High St. Turn right on High. Church is on left approximately 3 blocks, just past stop light at Moore and High.

Carpools for Sunday field trips will meet at the church at 8:30am. Park on the street. Directions available to Swanton Pacific Ranch.
